The kitchen cooked up 55 pots of their incredible asparagus chowder <u>and the people</u> <u>LOVED it</u> – as always. Wally, Karen Andersen and Crew got to work mid-week and cut mounds of onions, broccoli and asparagus - and got the massive job done! Of the 55 large pots of chowder that were created 238 quarts were sold as *Cold Quarts To-Go* (a NEW popular favorite!).

Our thanks to the many bakers who created the wonderful, homemade cookies and brownies, to the "donators" who shopped and then donated many, many containers of half and half, chicken broth, soda and water and to the "feet-on-the-ground" folks who worked in and around the tents.

Each person was needed and each person was appreciated.

The total revenue raised from this year's festival came to \$5949 a bit higher than last year. Funds raised go towards the general upkeep of the church which in turn supports the Sharing Cupboard Food Pantry and many mission projects that our church supports throughout the year.

Each year we change things just a bit (as we did this year) and each year things seem to run even better. Again, a HUGE thanks to ALL who had a role in this year's festival!

# From our Boards and Committees

## **Church Council**

The Church Council will gather for a special meeting with our new bridge minister on Sunday, June 9. The date of the regular monthly meeting will be June 23<sup>rd</sup>.

### SHARING CUPBOARD

It was 22 years ago this spring that the Sharing Cupboard opened its doors to serve the community. It was learned very early that donations locally would not sustain it. Jan King helped the pantry to become affiliated with the Worcester County Food Bank, a partnership we still have. Later when I served on the WCFB advisory board we set up service areas. Our service area is West Brookfield, Warren and West Warren. It is, however, our policy to serve anyone who comes to our door. Then we try to help them find a pantry in their community. We serve 50-60 families monthly, which covers 125 people or so. We do not have large families at the moment. We mostly have retired people who need a little support in addition to whatever other sources they have. We have great contributions so we were able to get 2 new freezers. This means we won't have to crowd the small freezer in the church kitchen. We can certainly share if the church needs temporary space (like the Asparagus Festival) just clear it with the director.

Volunteers come and go. It is always amazing how when someone leaves another volunteer appears. We are fortunate.

Thanks to our church for providing space for this service to the communities in our area.

Thanks to Dee Blanton for helping us to get a Board of Directors and Bylaws set up.

### **Designated Term Pastoral Search Committee**

It has been more than 4 months now since our search committee submitted our church's Designated Term Pastor search profile was activated [January 26] for UCC clergy across the country to consider. Since then, unfortunately, our church has still received <u>no</u> profiles from interested UCC clergy.

As the 3 month mark of receiving no profiles drew close, our committee met with the Church Council in April to see if it would be financially feasible for the DTP compensation to be raised from that of a 1/2 time position to a 3/4 time one. That step seemed important because our committee had then learned from our Conference, that churches seeking 3/4 time DTP positions typically received significantly more candidates than those seeking 1/2 time ones. At that Council meeting, we learned that such a raise should be financially feasible, and the Council is in favor of it being done.

As the 4 month mark of still receiving no profiles drew close, our search committee met with the Church Council at its recent May meeting to discuss this concern in greater detail. As a result of that, our congregation's members have now been called to meet on Sunday, June 2, after our worship service, to discuss and vote on a funding proposal that will enable us to seek a 3/4 time DTP. If the vote at that June 2 meeting is in the affirmative, our search committee will then strive to have our church's search profile for a 3/4 time DTP activated as soon as possible.

Over the last couple of months, our search committee came to realize that the fulfillment of Designated Term Goals in our church's profile will, to a large degree, depend on volunteers from our congregation helping our new DTP work on them. We also realized there are some additional ways we can improve our church's profile, so it may have more appeal to potential candidates. Thus, our committee has now done the following:

1. We have simplified our Designated Term Goals to two points instead of three. Those two are:

- A. Strengthen our Practice of Being a Welcoming Church
- B. Expand our Presence in the Community

We have also changed the wording of some of the expectations in those two goals in order to decrease the emphasis on the pastor and put more emphasis on the help needed by our congregation. Also, rather than wait to secure a new DTP, we have <u>already begun</u> to ask our fellow parishioners to indicate their ideas on ways to accomplish such goals and their willingness to volunteer to help work on those goals for the good of our church.

2. To help make our church's profile more appealing, we have now added to it:

~ a number of the very positive aspects of our West Brookfield community,

~ mention of our church's recent Capital Campaign, supported by contributors from <u>both</u> our congregation and community, which has enabled our church to repair its beautiful steeple overlooking the Common and also add a mini-split system to better heat and cool our church.

We hope many members of our congregation will be able to attend that meeting of our congregation on Sunday, June 2, after our worship service.

# A Different Kind of Guest Speaker

On Sunday, May 26th Pat Jackman was our guest speaker and brought her portrayal of Antoinette Brown Blackwell to our morning service.

Antoinette Brown Blackwell was born in Henrietta, NY in 1825. Very early she began to speak publicly in the services of the local Congregational Church when she was only nine years old. She graduated from Oberlin College and completed theological studies there. However, she was refused a degree and ordination because she was a woman. It was at Oberlin College she met Lucy Stone and they became fast lifelong friends even marrying brothers. With great pleasure, she voted in 1920 at the age of 96 when women were given the vote.

#### The Dismas Family Farm

The Dismas Family Farm in Oakham provides vocational rehabilitation and supportive housing to homeless former prisoners on a twelve-acre working farm at 687 Lincoln Rd. in Oakham.

Our church has provided family-style suppers one Tuesday each month for several years. Each month we alternate between a pot-luck supper served at the church and bringing a meal to the farm in Oakham. Everyone is always welcome to join either of the suppers. Funds are available if you would like to provide an item for a meal but cannot afford to do so. See a member of the Mission Committee if you're interested in this option.

Dismas has a farm store on-sight offering handcrafted wooden items, farm fresh eggs, gifts and fresh picked produce. The store is open from April to December seven days a week from 9 AM to 7 PM. In addition to selling produce in the store, their vegetables are also donated to needy families and individuals in Worcester.

The farm can always use monetary donations plus grocery cards, towels, toiletries, and sheets.

Mark your calendar for Sunday, **June 16 for their Father's Day BBQ.** They will serve food at no cost, animals will be available for petting and viewing and there will be yard games for children from 12 to 3 pm.
