# WEST BROOKFIELD'S ASPARAGUS, FLOWER & HERITAGE FESTIVAL SATURDAY MAY 18th!

Spring is in the air which means that the Asparagus Festival is just around the corner! If you are new to W. Brookfield and our church community, the Asparagus Festival is a huge and beautiful celebration of spring in New England! This town-sponsored event takes place on the town common and features art vendors, crafters, growers and food vendors from across our area. It is a very

important day in the life of West Brookfield – and our church.

Our church participates by offering our **Famous Asparagus Chowder!** This chowder has been made since year one of the festival – in fact the festival was actually started by our church many years ago, but we gave it up when it became too big. We have been serving our famous chowder every year since. Because last year's response to setting our chowder tent up on the church lawn was so successful, we are doing it again! We will be selling our HOT asparagus chowder (by the cup) -- and offering our COLD chowder (by the quart) from both a tent on the common AND one on the church lawn.

Our Church's Designated Term Pastor search profile has been available online to UCC clergy since January 26, and so far we have received no profiles from any potentially interested UCC clergy. Given this situation, our search committee has conferred with both Southern New England Conference staff members and also our Church Council. The result is that the following two steps are now being considered to increase interest in the DTP position we are offering.

- 1. Our search committee is reviewing our search profile and focusing particularly on simplifying the Designated Term Goals that our new DTP would be considered responsible for accomplishing, in addition to the usual responsibilities a minister has in serving a church.
- 2. Members of our church who work with its finances are considering whether it would be feasible or not for our church to increase the amount of compensation being offered for this 3 year position, particularly to increase it from the present 1/2-time position to a 3/4-time one. We have now learned from the SNEUCC that churches offering 3/4-time DTP positions tend to receive about three to four times as many applicants as those offering 1/2-time DTP positions. If it is considered feasible to increase that compensation, a request to do so will be presented to our congregation for discussion and its vote.

More information will be forthcoming on the above items as work is done on them.

On April 14, our search committee held an informal, special meeting of our church to begin working on the Designated Term Goal to **Review and Strengthen our Practice of Being a Welcoming Church**. We thank all who came to that meeting and shared their ideas about ways to accomplish that goal. We are now inviting our parishioners to volunteer to help implement such ideas. Our committee recognizes that the efforts of our own parishioners will be absolutely necessary to achieve this important goal. So, please consider volunteering. And, to volunteer, please speak with any member of our search committee. **Thank you!** 

#### **New Committee Formed!**

At the meeting that was held on April 14<sup>th</sup> volunteers stepped forward to get things started with our goal of being an even more welcoming church. Exploring what it means to be An Open and Affirming church has been discussed in Church Council for many months now (actually years) and Doug Showalter, Karen Murphy and Terry Hall stepped forward to form this committee. Linda Barron and Mary Deotte are interested in assisting with guidance and consulting. We are seeking others!
