### From Our Bridge Pastor



### The Holy Spirit and Us

"For it has seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us . . . "

Acts 15:28

This Sunday we celebrate Ascension Sunday...and discover how the ascension of Christ can deeply connect with our lives; it is not just some "beam me up, Scottie" moment! But what I really can't wait for is June 8, the church's brightest, boldest, and most energetic day: Pentecost.

Actually, Pentecost isn't just the Christian Church's day; it was first of all a Jewish celebration. Fifty days after the feast of Passover (the celebration of deliverance from Egypt) comes the celebration of First Fruits, a thanksgiving for the wheat harvest and for the law given to Moses at Mt. Sinai. The feast is called Shavu'ot, or Weeks, because it is a week of weeks plus one—50 days. Pentecost is the Greek word for the 50<sup>th</sup> day.

There ends the history lesson . . . and the similarity between the Jewish Pentecost and the Pentecost which we celebrate. Shavu'ot became a quiet celebration of the old and the predictable, the certain and the dependable. The Pentecost that we celebrate as Christians is about the coming of the Holy Spirit recorded in Acts 2. Our Pentecost comes closer than any other day of the year to being raucous and out-of-control. This is the time to realize, to *feel*, that the Spirit blows where the Spirit will---unexpectedly, powerfully, amazingly, ridiculously. Pentecost evokes images and memories different than any other worship celebration: Blazing red. Winds of change. Tongues of flame. Fire of love. *If you have the chance, wear red to worship on Pentecost Sunday!* 

The results of the Spirit's coming were nothing short of astonishing. The followers of Christ received a power they had not known before. The Spirit breathed life and discernment and reconciliation into the disciples, and they began to share the Good News.

I hope this Pentecost propels us into a summer of the same life and power. Pentecost is not a reminder of the "good old days" when God *really* reached into and through the disciples. The fire and energy to spread the Good News of the grace of Christ and the love of God isn't something to consign to the shelves of church history; it is the primary reason for the existence of the church today.

Our June 8 worship will recall Pentecost. But it will not recreate it. That happens only when we recognize the presence, the power, and the unpredictable press of the Spirit on *our* lives. And I pray that summer will not be a time to set aside the Spirit . . . but rather to affirm her presence and power. There is so much for the folks of FCCWB to look forward to in the coming months, with the exciting arrival of a pastor who will share and

stimulate your life and witness for years to come. But Pentecost is the most vivid reminder that The Church isn't its leaders; it is all you saints doing the work of ministry...equipped by the gifted pastor and teacher you are welcoming (Ephesians 4:11-12). You have such a bright future...if you all keep at it!

I pray we will all open ourselves to the power of Pentecost; that we will experience the power of the Holy Spirit to turn sadness into joy, infuse confidence where there is fear, create faith where there is doubt, and generate power where there is weakness. I pray that First Congregational Church will experience Pentecost . . . again and anew. My real excitement in life comes in knowing that *you* are where the progress of the Holy Spirit is really happening.

### **Designated Term Pastoral Search Committee**

We are very happy to report that on Sunday, May 11, our congregation at a specially called meeting following our worship service voted unanimously to call Dr. Douglas J. Williamson to serve as our church's Designated Term Minister for the next three years. Doug was ordained as a United Methodist minister, and since 2019 he has been serving a United Church of Christ church in Ohio. He was officially granted UCC ministerial standing (Dual Standing) while serving that church, and he is expected to be granted that same UCC standing while serving our church. His ministerial profile came to our search committee from our UCC Conference, which vetted him and recommended that we consider him to serve our church. Our congregation very much enjoyed meeting Doug and his wife Karen during their visit to our church on that candidating weekend.



When will Doug begin to serve our church? The short answer to that question is that he is required, according to his Call Agreement (signed by him and leaders of our church on May 11, after the congregation's vote), to begin serving our church between August 17 and the end of September of 2025. That range was chosen based on estimates of the time that might be required for him to depart from his current church, find and secure housing in our area, and move here. Doug has been clear though that he hopes he'll be able to begin serving our church sooner rather than later in that time range.

As of this writing, our search committee has learned that Doug and Karen have put an offer on a house about 20 minutes or so away from our church, and their offer has been <u>accepted</u>. So, that is very good news. However, that was a challenge for them because once they returned to Ohio after visiting us, they were not in a position to come back to Massachusetts to see that house in

person before they bid on it. We certainly appreciate their determination to fulfill their commitment to our church. In sending our committee that recent good news, Doug also told us: "We are so looking forward to being with you folks and the rest of the church family in the very near future."

Our committee and congregation are now looking forward eagerly to Doug's ministry in our church and his help as we now move into our future and continue to pursue our designated term goals of (1) strengthening our practice of being a Welcoming Church and (2) expanding our presence in the community.
